"In our society, there's a prevalent malpractice of judging an individual's character based on their physical appearance or attributes. Those who fit into the societal mold are often considered superior, while those with unique features are relegated to inferior status. The play 'Goradhan Ke Jootey' (Goradhan's Shoes) highlights the plight of a girl, Mathra, who doesn't conform to societal norms due to her unusually large feet. The story revolves around Mathra's wedding, arranged by her grandfather in her childhood. As the wedding approaches, both families face a dilemma: finding shoes to fit Mathra's large feet. This seemingly trivial issue snowballs into a massive problem, reflecting the societal pressures and prejudices. During the search for shoes, the narrative touches upon various themes: gender-based discrimination, domestic violence, and the constraints faced by women. Mathra's aunt, who escaped an abusive marriage and started anew in Delhi, represents the struggles of women seeking independence. As the story unfolds, Mathra's dreams of becoming a basketball player are revealed. However, she had sacrificed her aspirations to maintain family honor and fulfill her grandfather's promise. The play poignantly portrays the clash between traditional expectations and individual desires. The climax revolves around Mathra's refusal to marry, citing her selection in the national basketball team. She asserts her right to wear shoes that fit her, symbolizing her desire for self-expression and freedom. Deepu, the groom, supports Mathra's decision, and together they defy societal norms. Goradhan's Shoes becomes a metaphor for the couple's quest for a better society, where individuals can think freely and live without constraints. They're not abandoning their responsibilities or family but seeking to break free from the societal prison that restricts their growth."

Chauthi Cigarette is a compelling exploration of desire and ambition, probing the lengths to which individuals will go to fulfill their dreams. The narrative unfolds around two contrasting figures—Vireshwar Sengupta and Samrendu Sanyal—whose intertwined fates illuminate the complexities of success and fulfillment. Vireshwar Sengupta is a humble Bengali writer whose pen dances across the pages of newspaper columns, eking out a modest existence. With his modest means, he juggles the responsibilities of supporting his wife and three children in their simple, middle-class life. His dreams, though restrained by financial constraints, are rich with creativity and potential. In stark contrast, Samrendu Sanyal is a wealthy industrialist, the epitome of affluence and influence. Yet, despite his immense success in the business realm, he harbors a burning desire to be acknowledged as a writer. To achieve this, he conspires to obtain Vireshwar's brilliant literary creations, publishing them under his own name to win the prestigious Booker Prize. This act of literary appropriation not only brings Samrendu the acclaim he craves but also secures Vireshwar a financial windfall through royalties. The crux of the play lies in the juxtaposition of their achievements and the subsequent emotional toll. While Vireshwar's works bring Samrendu the coveted prize and elevate his status, the stolen glory leaves Samrendu hollow and discontent. Simultaneously, Vireshwar's newfound financial stability does little to satiate his yearning for recognition and creative fulfillment. In the end, both men reach their goals but find themselves ensnared in a web of dissatisfaction and unhappiness. The play poignantly underscores the irony of their circumstances, where the pursuit of ambition leads not to contentment, but to an unsettling void.

An exploration of free will, war and mathematics. From the Simonyi Professor for the Public Understanding of Science at Oxford University comes a ground-breaking new play The Axiom of Choice. Eminent mathematician Andre Weil is on a journey from France to India, Finland and beyond, to discover whether we really have free will or if all our choices are predetermined. Expect mathematics, movement but most of all the true story of how one man dodged death on more than one occasion. Imprisoned in Rouen during the Second World War, Weil faces a choice that will determine his fate - but his decision just doesn't make sense. Is life a mathematical theorem of logical strands? Because sometimes it just doesn't add up. This is Marcus' second work to be performed in India, following I is a Strange Loop. Most recently he has published his seventh book - Around the World in 80 Games, which has just been released in paperback.
