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# SPOTLIGHT

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Spotlight began with an aim to promote the voices that matter and the ones we believe in. And also, to create a space for audience and the artist to be one. The theatrical productions didn't end after the given duration, the stories and impact continued through the dialogue that followed the performances.

Over the years, Spotlight has grown, in its own simple and small ways. In 2023, it focused on artists under thirty, many of whom were stepping onto a stage for the first time. Last year, it turned to solo performances, trusting a single voice to hold a room. And the thing about spotlight is, there is no duration or language barrier, it is always about the story and the voice of the storyteller...

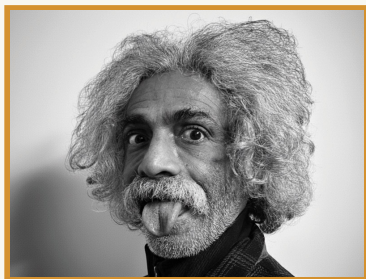
This year, the belief led us to women. We feel that women are born storytellers and a space, which is all about the stories of womanhood — told by women and for women, is much needed in today's time. A safe space where a woman is seen, heard and understood. And what better place than a stage?

What started as a modest curatorial choice quickly expanded, simply because of how much strong, thoughtful work was being made by women. In 2025, Spotlight is led largely by women directors and spreads across multiple stages, as it just could not be limited to one, with many performances engaging with different experiences and stages of womanhood.

Making space for women is not about just creating a category — it is about creating room. Room for voices that are often sidelined, for stories that are deeply personal, and for perspectives that deserve to be seen and heard on their own terms.

This solo piece draws from the river Brahmaputra, the landscape of Majuli, and the social, cultural, and spiritual life of its people. It celebrates the spirit of Majuli and the flow of the Brahmaputra, reflecting the deep bond between the community, their land, and their resilient relationship with the river. The performance begins at any point, like stepping onto an island, and gradually expands into a vast spatial journey. The performer moves like the river itself, shifting qualities and evoking multiple journeys inspired by visits to Majuli. The rhythms, folk expressions, the pain of homes being washed away, the joy of rain, the spiritual energy of the Satras, and the imagery of the boat together create the world of Majuli. The piece also explores the challenge of balancing traditional knowledge with modernity, sharing stories of adaptability that resonate far beyond the Brahmaputra. As the river faces rapid changes due to hydroelectric and infrastructure projects, the countless stories of resilience and people-river relationships, including the one shared here, must guide how these changes unfold.

This piece is about loss and grief, but also about love, voice, and song. Between the darkness of broken dreams and the fragile slope of happiness lies the story of a once-beautiful, unforgettable voice now faded from memory. Over nearly a year of interviews, Mallika Taneja uncovered this forgotten voice, a life of dreams made and broken, a voice that longed to be heard but remained trapped within the domestic. With a harmonium, a microphone, and objects from her childhood, she returns to search for the person she lost: a singer, her songs, and something more. As she moves between remembering and becoming, searching and singing, she brings back songs we may never have heard yet somehow know, inviting us into a familiar story of grief, memory, and the tender act of not-forgetting.

Dhai Akhar is a feel-good romantic comedy that explores the timeless, chaotic, and comically repetitive nature of love across generations. But history repeats itself when their daughter Babli falls for Baja Babu, a sweet, slightly naïve young man. Ironically, Priyamvada, once the rebel, now reacts just like her strict mother did, worrying about “practicality” and resisting the match, while Martand watches with philosophical amusement. After the expected drama, Babli and Baja marry, and soon begin to resemble Martand and Priyamvada, proving that love makes every generation replay the same roles in its own delightful way.

Raag-Mad is an exploratory performance that brings together India's folk and classical traditions, celebrating their shared roots and living connection. Folk music carries the stories and earthiness of daily life, while classical music offers the depth and discipline of raga. Together, they create a unified musical language.

Instead of presenting the styles separately, Raag-Mad blends them into one fluid experience. Kamaicha and violin converse melodically, supported by folk and classical vocalists. Dholak and khartal meet tabla, nagada, and pakhawaj, creating a vibrant rhythmic exchange that highlights how naturally these two traditions speak to each other.

Dastan-e-Guru Dutt is a musical tribute to the cinematic legend not through film reels, but through the centuries-old tradition of oral storytelling, in the form of dastangoi to mark his birth centenary.

It is a tribute that commemorates his enduring legacy in a form he would have appreciated—artistic, experimental, and deeply human. Instead of a conventional homage, Dastan-e-Guru Dutt allows audiences to experience his world as though he were present – through the cadences of poetry, the resonance of music, and the intimacy of storytelling where his life and art breathe again in words and in songs.

The Dastan will be rendered by India's First Woman Dastango, Ms. Fouzia Dastango, renowned for her many captivating performances, particularly her renditions on Meena Kumari, Madhubala, Krishna, and Ram. She brings her own unique style of storytelling, seamlessly blending narrative with songs, either composed by the artist herself or drawn from the films. The songs will be sung by Mrs. Latika Jain, a soulful singer from Mumbai. The research for Dastan-e-Guru Dutt has been done by Ms. Asha Batra, Founder of Cinemaazi, a private digital archive and research centre on Indian Cinema. The script is penned by Mr. Abbas Qamar.

Durga and Lakshmi, two artists- one a human, the other a sentient stereo player invite you for a feast, that soon turns into a performance of fears. Durga asks herself what epitomizes “a woman”, finally landing on the idea of a ‘Garam Roti’- the humble Indian flatbread. What starts as a personal reflection on the matter, culminates into an exercise of communal listening to rants (recordings) of women from across India. The play moves through borders of fiction into the non-fiction realm with the ‘Garam Roti Library’- an audio collection of women sharing their anecdotes, thoughts on tradition, labour and revolution.

What should a women wear or not ? Who decides ? Nanga Kapda (The Naked Cloth) is a research-based performance that focuses on the question of choice and freedom associated with weaving practices and women's bodies. The research for this performance is based on the long history of textile production in India, a work principally done by women. Thus Nanga Kapda emerges as a feminist re-take of performance as resistance, which is deeply located in the material presence of textiles.

This performance unfolds how the materiality of the body, which is a feminist subject, works with or interrupts the materiality of a commodity such as textiles. It intersects women's desire for freedom expressed through textiles with contemporary feminist perspectives on visibility, moral policing, and violence.

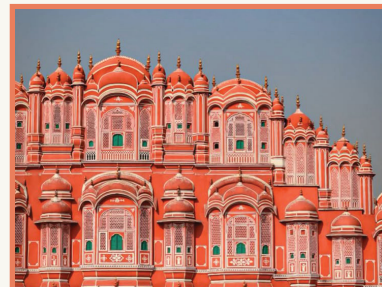

## JAIPUR: THE SEEN & THE UNSEEN

This heritage walk explores the historic core of Jaipur through its narrow lanes, ancient havelis, bustling markets, and iconic city gates. Starting at Sanganeri Gate, it examines the significance of this landmark before moving into areas that showcase key Indo-Saracenic and Rajput architecture. The route also passes through bazaars like Johari Bazaar and Sirah Dyodhi Bazaar, home to generations of skilled artisans.

The walk also highlights the symbolism of Jaipur's urban layout—planned in 1727 by Maharaja Sawai Jai Singh II according to Vastu Shastra—making Jaipur India's first planned city. Participants gain insights into the city's foundation, royal legacy, and its enduring influence on India's cultural and architectural identity.

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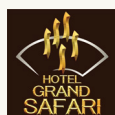
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
